About Karad

Karad is situated on 180o confluence of rivers Krishna and Koyana, a rare geographical phenomenon, in Satara district of Maharashtra. It is a well-known educational hub and is the bastion of the Cooperative movement. Its name features in history as Karhatak, the capital of Pandava king Sahadev. Adding to Karad's ancient heritage are the Agashiv Caves, dating back to around the 3rd century BCE. These rock-cut caves, linked to early Buddhist monastic life, stand as evidence of the region's continuity from ancient spiritual traditions through medieval political history, including its association with the broader legacy of the Maratha Empire.

About the Institution and College

Shikshan Mandal, Karad was established in 1921, in the memory of Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak-the legendary freedom fighter, philosopher, and nationalist leader. This educational trust is living tribute to Tilak's profound contributions to India's independence movement.

Founded in 1921, Shikshan Mandal stands as a prestigious educational institution in Karad, dedicated to fostering a blend of academic excellence, scientific mindset, character development, patriotism, and a sense of social belonging among its students. It is the alma mater of Swargiya Yashwantrao Chavan Saheb, the architect of modern Maharashtra; Prithviraj Chavan; Khashaba Dadasaheb Jadhav; and many other illustrious personalities.

Demonstrating its visionary outlook and commitment to women's education, Shikshan Mandal, Karad established Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Karad to meet the growing needs for quality higher education for girls in and around Karad. Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Karad was established on August 7th, 1986, under the auspices of Shikshan Mandal, Karad. It is the first women's college in Satara district affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Since its inception, the college has been committed to empowering girl students by providing access to modern, scientific and value-based higher education along with training in employment-oriented skills and opportunities for employment and entrepreneurship, thereby enabling them to become self-reliant. Affiliated to Shivaji University, the college offers undergraduate programmes in Arts, Commerce and Science, along with a postgraduate programme in Geography. The college also has a Ph.D. Research Centre in Geography recognized by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. In the year 2026, the college started 191 'Skill Development Courses' approved by 'MAHARASHTRA BUSINESS TRAINING BOARD'. In recognition of its sustained commitment to quality education and institutional excellence, the college was reaccredited with CGPA 2.85 by the NAAC in the fourth cycle of accreditation in February 2025.
